An updated version of the Standard Terms database was released on 21 August 2017. A new tagging feature has been added, which will allow the introduction of 'non-traditional' Standard Terms, i.e. terms that are not intended for use in marketing authorisation applications and labelling, but for other specific purposes such as adverse-event reporting.
